OUR YOUTH PRAYS WITH THE WORD OF GOD

USING THE Dia 1 OgOs Semanal es cOn Jesus

Diálogos Semanales con Jesús (DSJ) (Weekly Dialogues with Jesus) is a series of books, the main purpose of which is to offer our young people a way to get to know the living Word of God in relation to the richness of liturgical life and through the experience of Lectio Divina, a type of Sacred Scripture reading that has been part of the Catholic tradition for many years. This type of approach to the reading and meditation of Sacred Scripture inspires and challenges the young person to be a protagonist in the world of his/her own time.

Faithful to that purpose and using the DSJ, Fe y Vida's biblical team developed a program, which provided training to Latino youth in dioceses across the country during 2008 and 2009.

This project, partially subsidized by the American Bible Society, was organized into different stages. First was the preparation of a Manual and other pertinent materials; secondly, we extended an invitation to each diocese to send two leaders to a training of trainers program, who in turn, would commit themselves to offer two workshops within their respective dioceses. The response was very positive, and the training took place in Los Angeles, CA, on May 2-4, 2008 with 64 delegates from 16 dioceses.

These trained leaders took care of the third stage, which consisted of the local training at each of their dioceses. Between September, 2008 and April, 2009, twenty workshops were offered in the Arch/Dioceses of Atlanta, GA; Boise, ID; Charlotte, NC; Dallas/Forth Worth, TX; Kansas City, KS; Portland, OR; Pueblo, CO; Saint Paul; MN; Salt Lake City, UT; Santa Rosa, CA; and Yakima, WA. This part of the project has become an ongoing ministry for Fe y Vida.

In the fourth stage the Manual was revised based on the evaluations and suggestions from the diocesan workshops and a national team was put together. The members of the "DSJ National Team," as it is known to us, are: Sr. Francis Aldama, Adriana Visoso Valverde, Elizabeth Torres, Edith Ramírez, Miguel Sánchez, Ricardo Veloz, José Alfredo Morán, Juan Carlos Solorio, Rico Sotelo and Walter F. Mena. We travel to the arch/dioceses to offer similar training workshops.

Between August, 2009 and December, 2009, the Team offered 12 workshops in the arch/dioceses of Galveston-Houston, TX; Stockton, CA; Grand Rapids, MI; Denver, CO; Louisville, KY; Boston, MA; Camden, NJ; Philadelphia and Harrisburg, PA; and Phoenix, AZ. At the end of the fourth stage of this project included a training of trainers program and 36 workshops in 22 dioceses around the country. Approximately 1,000 young Latinos were trained on *Lectio Divina* and the liturgical cycle.

The last stage was the final edition of the Manual, which is a comprehensive tool for training the young people and their mentors in *Lectio Divina*, based on the Sunday Lectionary, and will be available for download free of charge on our biblical website, now under construction. We give thanks to God for the witnessing and commitment of the young people, as well as for the interest and welcoming of the dioceses. This is certainly of great motivation for us in the biblical pastoral team of Fe y Vida. We want to convey our gratitude to the American Bible Society, the diocesan personnel, the young trainers, and the adults and young people that have participated in the workshops. Their ongoing dedication to ministering Catholic Latino youth and young adults is a gift from God to the Church in the U.S. We, at Fe y Vida, renew our own commitment to continue inviting our young people to get to know the Word of God, pray with the Word, and embrace it wholeheartedly.

The last meeting of Fe y Vida's board of directors and staff was blessed with a session which followed a process called "Appreciative Inquiry," facilitated by Shryl McCormick, an expert in the field of organizational performance and development. In a prayerful spirit, Shryl helped us review together our past fifteen years, going over each and every project, and bringing forth all the positive outcomes. Another important part of the process was identifying strengths, and how to apply them to those areas that we want and need to develop.

Although this type of process was practically new to all of us, we were readily engaged in it, and it became clear at the end that we had participated in a very dynamic experience—a fine alternative to other processes—to visualize ideals as well as identify priorities. Bishop Carlos A. Sevilla, SJ, our Chairman of the Board, was an inspiring participant who encouraged us to continue our mission, and all of us felt that the bond among us had been strengthened while our commitment to mission was renewed. It was the perfect activity to complete Fe y Vida's Quinceañera celebrations and enter into our next stage.

However, this was not the end of our productive meeting. Blessings kept rushing in when three young adults from the Diocese of Santa Rosa joined us that evening. Alfonso Mojica, Juan Carlos and Edna Solorio, together with Abraham Solar, member of Fe y Vida's board and pastoral team, candidly shared with us significant parts of their faith journey. In an informal and dynamic conversation they told us how Fe y Vida has influenced their personal and family lives, as well as their ministry in a community of faith.



"Unsuccessfully, we tried for many years to organize *Pastoral Juvenil* in the diocese. I believe that the formation and training courses of Fe y Vida helped us to grow in

our faith, and to develop leadership skills to serve the Church from our youth. Now, it is our turn to prepare other young men and women, which is what we are doing in collaboration with Stan Cordero, the diocesan director of youth ministry. I belong to the National Catholic Network of Pastoral Juvenil Hispana (La Red) where I have the opportunity of working with other young people at a national level. I like music and play the guitar, and this is also another way of evangelizing."

CathOllc latino Youth and Parents Project

We at Instituto Fe y Vida are very excited about the progress of our Catholic Latino Youth and Parents Project (CLYPP). It was conceived at the end of 2007 and brought to fruition by a generous grant of the Lilly Endowment.

This four-year project, under the guidance of Ken Johnson-Mondragón, our Director of Research and Resource Center, will support ministry with Catholic Latino youth in parishes and Catholic schools throughout the country over the next decade. The goal is to provide the necessary ministry resources and training programs to effectively engage youth ministry professionals, Latino young adult leaders, and Hispanic parents in the expansion and improvement of religious formation for Hispanic Catholic adolescents.

After about 18 months of field research and planning, the editorial team of writers gathered in Houston in January of this year to kick off Phase 2 of the project. Among the tasks planned for this phase of the project are: (a) a guidebook for ministry with Hispanic teens and their parents; (b) resources for ministry with

adolescents: youth retreats and leadership formation workshops, supplemental materials for Confirmation, a collection of youth ministry session plans that relates gospel themes to life issues commonly faced by Latino teens, and a resource for planning service projects in Latino communities;

and (c) a set of seven modular formation programs for ministry with parents, with accompanying workbooks and resource materials. These materials will begin to appear in published form next year.

The title of the new bilingual publication is Hispanic Youth and Young Adult Ministry in the United States: Bridging Hispanic and Mainstream Ministry to Forge the Church Anew in 21st Century America.

Written by Ken Johnson-Mondragón, this paper was commissioned for the June 2009 National Symposium on Hispanic Ministry at Boston College. It will also appear shortly with six other papers presented at the symposium in a book to be published by Miami-based Convivium Press. The bilingual book, edited by Hosffman Ospino, PhD, will be titled Hispanic Ministry in the 21st Century: Present and Future.

Combining insights from the National Study of Youth and Religion (NSYR) and the First National Encuentro for Hispanic Youth and Young Adult Ministry (PENPJH by its initials in Spanish), the new *Perspectives* provides a summary and update of the current demographics and social context of young Hispanic Catholics.

Key differences between Hispanic and mainstream approaches to youth and young adult ministry are highlighted, as well as an analysis of the current strengths, challenges, and recent advances regarding the pastoral response to Latino youth and young adults in the Catholic Church. The paper concludes with a series of pastoral recommendations for the local, diocesan, and national development of these ministries.

FE Y VIDA PRESENTS AT BOSTON COLLEGE

Our Executive Director, Carmen María Cervantes, EdD, was the presenter at two conferences sponsored by the School of Theology and Ministry of Boston College, and titled "The Imperative of Ministering to Hispanic Youth: Pastoral Juvenil Hispana." The conferences were offered in Spanish and English on March 6 and 8, 2010, respectively.

Dr. Cervantes explained the urgent need for all youth ministry leaders to embrace models that respond to the shifting demographics transforming the face of the church throughout the country. She introduced the model of Pastoral Juvenil Hispana as a treasure for the church. During the presentation, she explored Pastoral Juvenil Hispana in comparison to traditional models for youth ministry, its contributions and challenges, and also provided insights on the resources available for ministers working or planning to work with Hispanic youth.
